

## Be Careful on the River

Sunday, June 14, 2015 - Authorities say a **body found in the Raritan River** is likely that of a missing Newark woman who reportedly had been swept away by the current.

Using a side scan sonar device, state police initially located the body around 8:30 p.m. Saturday. It was about 50 yards offshore, but the river's strong currents prevented a dive team from reaching the body.

The body was removed from the water around 7 a.m. Sunday. The Coast Guard and several local agencies had conducted a lengthy search that started early Saturday, shortly after a friend reported that the 22-year-old Newark had entered the river near the Victory Bridge in Perth Amboy and then disappeared. The woman's name has not been released.

### **Body found in Raritan River ID'd as suspected Driscoll Bridge jumper-** updated May 18, 2015 at 3:20 PM

State police say the body discovered floating in the Raritan River Saturday has been identified as Michael Beadle, the High Bridge man suspected of jumping from the Driscoll Bridge in April. Investigators have determined that Beadle, 52, died by suicide. No foul play is suspected, said New Jersey State Police spokesman Sergeant Jeff Flynn Monday.

Beadle was reported missing on April 7, after a van registered to him was spotted that afternoon sitting on the shoulder of the bridge with its hazard lights turned on. State police arriving at the scene that day found the vehicle empty with its engine running. Investigators later initiated a search of the waters surrounding the Driscoll Bridge, but beadle's body was not recovered until Saturday after civilian boaters reported seeing his remains floating near the base of the Driscoll Bridge.
